Tuesday, 6/4

- 6:15 - 7:35 pm **Where's Poppa? (Going Ape) (1970)** — When a NY attorney meets the girl of his dreams, he schemes to eliminate his senile mother, fearing that her batty eccentricities will chase the girl away. An outrageous, buckwild comedy, w/ Ruth Gordon, George Segal & Rob Reiner. Directed by Carl Reiner.
- 7:35 – 9:15 pm **Weekend at Bernie's (1989)** — Another dark comedy. A pair of losers try to pretend that their murdered employer is really alive, but the murderer is out to "finish him off."

Tuesday, 6/11

- 6:15 – 6:45 pm **Jazz: An American Story** — NEA Jazz in the Schools presents the history of jazz, integrating the story with the sweep of American social, economic, and political developments.
- 6:45 – 9:00 pm **The Cotton Club (1984)** — A jazz musician at the legendary 1930s nightclub falls for the moll of a psychotic gangster. A classic mobster story peppered with the jazz music that made the club so famous, w/ Richard Gere, Gregory Hines & Diane Lane. Directed by Francis Ford Coppola.

- 6 - 10 pm **ORIENTE — Jazz Concert** — Fusing Cuban rhythms with jazz and blues, Oriente's soulful, signature sound features guitar, brass, and ferocious Afro-Latin percussion.

Tuesday, 6/18

- 6:15 - 8:20 pm **The Great Dictator (1940)** — A poor but kind Jewish barber living in the slums of fictional Tomania gets mistaken for the anti-Semitic dictator who rules the country. Charlie Chaplin plays both characters in this pointed satire of Adolf Hitler's Nazi Germany.
- 8:20 - 10:40 pm **Limelight (1952)** — A fading comedian and a suicidally despondent ballet dancer must look to each other to find meaning and hope in their lives. Charlie Chaplin directs and stars.

- 6:15 - 8:00 pm **That's Dancing! (1985)** – The history of dance depicted on film. Musical documentary hosted by Sammy Davis Jr., Gene Kelly, Liza Minelli, Ray Bolger & Mikhail Baryshnikov.
- 8:00 - 10:15 pm **The Red Shoes (1948)** – A young ballet dancer is torn between the man she loves and her pursuit to become a prima ballerina. British drama based on a fairy tale by Hans Christian Andersen.
