6:15 - 8:35 pm **Rosewood (1997)** - Dramatization of a horrific racist lynch mob attack on an African American town in Florida in 1923. The town was burned to the ground because of a lie—but some escaped and survived. (Directed by John Singleton)

8:40 – 11:05 pm **A Time to Kill (1996)** - A young White lawyer defends a Black man accused of murdering two men who raped his 10year-old daughter. As the trial date approaches, all hell breaks loose. (Starring Matthew McConaughey, Sandra Bullock, Samuel L. Jackson & Kevin Spacey. Based on a novel by John Grisham.)

- 6:15 8:05 pm **500 Years Later (2005)** Documentary exploring the tragic legacy of the forced migration of untold thousands of Africans from their homeland and the unique challenges that have resulted from this displacement. Filmed in over twenty countries on five continents, this unflinching films sheds new light on the problems of racial inequalities, poverty and oppression. (with Maulana Karenga, Molefi K. Asante, Bill Cosby, Amiri Baraka, and many others)
- 8:10 10:50 pm **Black in Latin America (2011)** In a style similar to "Wonders of the African World", Henry Louis Gates will travel to places in Latin America where Africa has touched the continent with lasting cultural results to explore what happens when African and Hispanic worlds meet.

- 6:15 8:00 pm Whale Rider (2002) A contemporary story of love, rejection and triumph as an 11-year-old Maori girl in New Zealand fights to fulfill a destiny her grandfather refuses to recognize.
- 8:05 8:15 pm U.S. vs. Dakota War in Minnesota (Audio) New documentary remembers the largest mass execution in U.S. history.
- 8:20 9:05 pm **Blue Planet (1990)** This documentary filmed in cooperation with NASA presents photographic images of the earth taken from outer space, inspiring an emotional celebration of life on the planet Earth, while also pointing out the visible effects of pollution and ozone depletion.

- 6:15 8:05 pm **Big Night (1996)** A failing Italian restaurant run by two brothers gambles on one special night to try to save the business. (Starring Stanley Tucci, Tony Shalhoub, and Isabella Rossellini; with Marc Anthony and Liev Schreiber)
- 8:10 9:55 pm **Babette's Feast (1987)** In 19th century Denmark, two adult sisters are presented with a chance to leave their isolated village, but they both choose to stay to care for their father, the pastor of a small Protestant church. Decades later, the sisters take in a French woman who prepares a grand feast in gratitude—a lavish meal eclipsed only by her secret.
